The resident liaison officer discusses with you what will happen. This is your chance to ask questions about the positioning of your appliances and cupboards.



The kitchen designer will include your requests in his design wherever possible. You have a choice of unit colours and door handles and a choice of tile, paint and floor colour options.



The design is completed and you are shown a 3D plan of what your newly finished kitchen will look like.



Your existing kitchen and flooring are removed ready for

A team of tradesmen start the installation to the layout and colour scheme you've agreed.



Wall tiles & wall finishes are removed ready for the installation of new electrical sockets. Additional sockets are provided and positioned correctly for your appliances.



Following a thorough inspection of the finished work, ► your new kitchen will be handed over for you to enjoy. The whole job should take around 10 working days from arrival of the contactors to completion of the work.
